Love God and our neighbour. Luke 10:27



TRUTH - Colossians 1:13-23

He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross. And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, if indeed you continue in the faith, stable and steadfast, not shifting from the hope of the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed in all creation under heaven, and of which I, Paul, became a minister.

COMMAND - Colossians 3:5-10, 12-17

Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming. In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. ...

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

ACTION in the workplace - Colossians 3:22-4:1

Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord. Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ. For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality.

Masters, treat your bondservants justly and fairly, knowing that you also have a Master in heaven.

- Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat their produce. Take
 wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your
 daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there,
 and do not decrease. But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you
 into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your
 welfare. Jeremiah 29:5-7

Work in action in New Testament

- But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for members of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever. 1 Timothy 5:8
- And let our people learn to devote themselves to good works, so as to help cases of urgent need, and not be unfruitful. Titus 3:14
- Aspire to live quietly, and to mind your own affairs, and to work with your hands, as we instructed you, 1 Thessalonians 4:11
- Whoever has two tunics is to share with him who has none, and whoever has food is to do likewise. Luke 3:10-11


Every day we live out the narrative of our worldview - our beliefs and values.



Building for Christ in Business

Ultimately to glorify God - he is glorified when we:

- ✓ put our whole selves into our work, with a view toward pleasing God, not men (Col. 3:23-24).
- ✓ are honest, even when it hurts us or prevents us from getting ahead (Ps. 15, Gen. 39).
- ✓ honour our superiors and submit to their authority (1 Tim. 6:1; Rom. 13:7).
- ✓ treat our work associates with kindness and respect (Luke 6:31; Rom. 12:18).
- ✓ expose fraud or dishonesty or unethical behaviour (Eph. 5:11-13).
- √ approach our work prayerfully (1 Thess. 5:17).
- ✓ avoid complaining or grumbling, even in less-than-ideal work situations (Phil. 2:14-15).
- ✓ refuse to make work and money our idols (Matt. 6:24; Ecc. 5:10-12).
- ✓ plan diligently for the future (Prov. 21:5).
- √ live simply and give generously (Prov. 22:9; 1 Tim. 6:17-19).
- ✓ trust him to provide today what we need for today (Matt. 6:11).
- ✓ rest from work (Deut. 5:13-15; Ps. 46:10).
